skill level: Easy

One size

finished measurements

Approximately 12" across x 14" high (Not including strap)

yarn

BERROCO SUEDE (50 grs): 6 balls
(Shown in Berroco Love It – discontinued)

needles and notions

24" length circular needles, sizes 3 (3.00 mm) and 6 (4.00 mm) or size to obtain gauge

1 st marker

Two 1½" buttons

Two 2" buttons

gauge

20 sts and 30 rows = 4" in St st on larger needles

To save time, take time to check gauge

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NOTE: We recommend using yarns called for in our instructions. Every effort has been made to ensure that directions contained in this book are accurate and complete, however errors do occur. NOTE

Skuld is one of the three goddesses of destiny in Norse mythology. The trickiest thing about this bag is sewing on the stacked buttons. It's a great project to introduce you to charts.

BAG

With larger needle, cast on 130 sts. Place marker and join for working in the round. Work even, following chart, until piece measures 12½" from beg. Change to smaller needle.

Top Band: Work even in Garter St (purl 1 rnd, knit 1 rnd) until bag measures 14" from beg. Bind off.

STRAP

With smaller needle, cast on 250 sts. Do not join. Work even in Garter St (knit every rnd) for 1½". Bind off.

FINISHING

Flatten bag and sew bottom seam. Pin one end of strap to each side of bag on outside of Top Band so that the ends of strap extend 2½" down from bound-off edge. Stack smaller buttons on top of larger buttons and sew one pair of buttons to each end of strap through bag. Weave in all ends and block as desired.



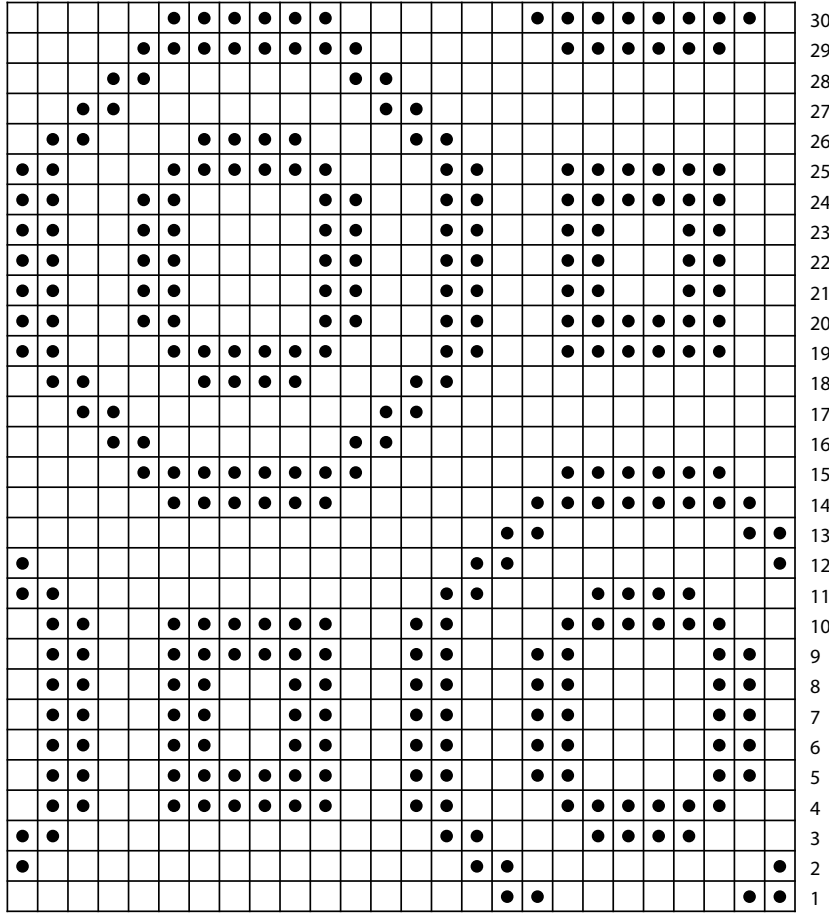
ABBREVIATIONS & TERMS

beg: beginning

rnd(s): round(s)

st(s): stitch(es)

Stockinette stitch (St st): Knit 1 row, purl 1 row alternately when working back and forth in rows. The knit side is the right side of work. Knit EVERY round when working in the round.



KEY TO CHART

knit

purl

CHART NOTES

Work from right to left on every rnd.

Repeat these 26 sts
